**Controlling Their Destiny** -- The Cru is the only ASC team with control of its own destiny going into the final four weeks of the season. UMHB is the only ASC team without a conference loss following ETBU's loss to Hardin-Simmons last Saturday. The ASC champion will also claim the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Division III National Championships. The Cru has won or shared four of the last five ASC titles and has advanced to the NCAA postseason in five of the last six seasons.

**Last Meeting** -- The Cru beat MC 41-14 in Belton last year after jumping out to a 38-7 lead. Freddie Rollins ran for two touchdowns and Josh Welch ran for a score and threw for another. Jarvis Thrasher also ran for a touchdown and Zach Newcomb kicked a pair of field goals for the Cru. UMHB ran for 246 yards and forced four turnovers in the game, picking off MC quarterback Brad Madden four times. The Choctaws did roll up 349 yards of offense while the Cru posted 356 yards of offense. Madden threw for 265 yards and Jake Allen caught six passes for 116 yards for MC. You can read more about that game inside this release.

**In the polls** -- The Cru is currently ranked 2nd in the nation in all three major polls. UMHB is #2 again this week in both the D3football.com Top 25 Weekly Poll and the Football Gazette Top 40 Poll. UMHB also were ranked 2nd nationally and received one first-place vote in last week's AFCA Top 25 Poll. UMHB is ranked 10th by the AFCA this week. The Cru was also picked to win the ASC in the league's annual preseason coaches' poll.

The Choctaws are not ranked, but are receiving votes in the D3football.com Top 25 poll. Mississippi College was picked to finish 3rd in the ASC in the preseason coaches' poll.

## UMHB vs MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE GAME NOTES PG. 2

**Last Time Out** -- The Cru is coming off a 70-14 manhandling of Louisiana College in Belton last Saturday. UMHB built a 49-14 halftime lead and then held the Wildcats scoreless in the second half. Jarvis Thrasher ran for 113 yards and three touchdowns and Quincy Daniels added 97 yards and three more scores. Josh Welch and Josh Saenz also ran for TD's and the Cru got fumble returns for touchdowns from Eric Henri and Clayton Burris. UMHB rolled up 420 yards rushing and 528 yards of total offense. The Cru defense held the Wildcats to -36 yards rushing and forced six turnovers in the win. You can read more about that game elsewhere in this release.

Mississippi College is coming off a 50-7 victory over a winless La Grange College team last Saturday in La Grange, Georgia. Chris Blanton ran for 108 yards and two touchdowns for the Choctaws and Joe Barker and Gerald Brown also ran for scores. Adam Shaffer threw for 295 yards and three touchdowns. Jake Allen caught seven of those passes for 119 yards. The Choctaws rolled up 369 passing yards and 562 yards of total offense in the victory. The Mississippi College defense held La Grange to 29 rushing yards and 127 yards of total offense while forcing two turnovers. Hunter Clark had a team-high seven tackles, added 2.5 tackles for loss and also picked off a pass to lead the MC defensive effort.

**The UMHB-Mississippi College Series** -- UMHB leads the all-time series 8-1 and rolled to a 49-3 victory in the last meeting between the two teams in Clinton back during the 2004 season. The teams are meeting at Robinson-Hale Stadium for just the fourth time overall. The Cru is 3-1 all-time against the Choctaws in Clinton with a 28-0 loss in the initial meeting in 1998, a 24-6 win in the 2000 meeting, a 39-24 victory in 2002 and then the 2004 win. UMHB has won eight straight against Mississippi College since dropping the initial meeting between the two teams in 1998. The Choctaws won that meeting 28-0 to mark the only time the Cru has been shut out in the ten-year history of the program.

**The Head Coaches** -- The Cru is under the direction of head coach Pete Fredenburg. Fredenburg (Southwest Texas State, 1970) is in his tenth season as the only head coach in the history of the UMHB football program. He has led The Cru to an 81-25 overall record and four ASC championships. Fredenburg led The Cru to the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl in 2004 and UMHB has qualified for the NCAA Division III National Championships five times. Fredenburg is 8-1 against Mississippi College, 65-14 against ASC conference opponents and 40-15 in road games in his career at UMHB. The Cru is 7-5 in the NCAA Division III National Championships under Fredenburg. He is a two-time ASC Coach of the Year and is a three-time AFCA Region III Coach of the Year. Fredenburg spent 13 years as an assistant coach at Baylor University, one season as an assistant at Louisiana State University and served as defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech University for three seasons prior to joining UMHB.

Norman Joseph is in his third season as head coach at Mississippi College but he is no stranger to the Cru. Joseph spent one season as the head coach at Louisiana College and also spent three seasons as the head coach at Belhaven College. He is 2-4 all-time against the Cru after winning the first two meetings between the two teams while he was at Belhaven. He then lost the final meeting, UMHB topped him at LC 68-16 in 2004 and took a 61-0 decision over the Joseph-led Choctaws in 2005 and won last year's meeting with MC 41-14. Joseph is 12-14 with the Choctaws and has posted a 33-34 career head coaching record. Joseph has also made assistant coaching stops at Midwestern State University, San Jose State University, Southern Mississippi and Northeast Louisiana.

**The Cru on the radio** -- All UMHB football games will be broadcast on KTEM radio (1400 AM) this season. The broadcast will start 15 minutes before game time. For the sixth straight season, Jim Cooper will handle play-by-play duties with former UMHB offensive coordinator George Haffner taking over on color commentary. The KTEM broadcast will also be available over the Internet on the UMHB athletic department web site. **Thrasher Runs Wild** -- **RB Jarvis Thrasher (Sr., Temple)** ran for 113 yards and three touchdowns on just 17 carries in the win over LC. It was the 10th 100-yard rushing day of Thrasher's career and moved him to within one of second-place Freddie Rollins' total of 11 on the UMHB career 100-yard rushing day list. Justin Bryson holds the UMHB school record with 17. Thrasher has topped the 100-yard mark in five of UMHB's six games this season. He leads the team with 763 yards and 12 touchdowns on 92 carries, an average of 8.3 yards per carry. Thrasher's 12 rushing TD's are tied for seventh-best on the Cru's single-season chart. He needs just three more to tie Justin Bryson's single-season record of 15 rushing touchdowns, set in 2004. Thrasher also moved into third place on the UMHB career rushing chart last Saturday by pushing his total to 2,219 yards. He passed Kevin Mitchell's total of 2,152. Freddie Rollins is in second place with 2,937 yards and Bryson holds the UMHB and ASC record with 3,672 career yards. Thrasher now has 30 career rushing touchdowns for fourth place on the Cru career list. He is five rushing scores behind second-place Chad Starnes, seven behind second-place Rollins (37) and eight short of Bryson's UMHB and ASC record of 38 rushing TD's.

**When UMHB has the ball --** The Cru offense continues to roll up monster numbers this season. UMHB enters this game averaging 55.3 points, 341.0 yards rushing, 171.8 yards passing and 512.8 yards of total offense per game. The Cru is converting 51 per cent of the time on third down and 50 per cent of the time on fourth downs this season. UMHB has turned the ball over 12 times (3 INT, 9 fumbles) and has allowed just five sacks. The Cru averages 6.2 yards per rushing attempt, 19.1 yards per completion and 7.2 yards per offensive play on the season. RB's Jarvis Thrasher and Quincy Daniels are splitting the load. Thrasher has 763 yards and 12 TD's on 92 carries and Daniels has taken his 85 carries for 645 yards and nine scores. QB Josh Welch is 40-72 passing for 757 yards and 11 touchdowns and he has rushed for 99 yards and three more scores. WR Patrick Oliver leads the team with 14 catches for 320 yards and eight touchdowns, but was shut out for the first time this season by Louisiana College. Fourteen different players have carried the ball at least once, five different players have thrown passes and 17 different players have caught passes for the Cru on the season. The return teams are giving the team good field position, averaging 12.8 yards per punt return and 18.8 yards per kickoff return. PK Joel Munoz has hit 5-5 field goals this year and is 39-41 on extra points. James Crawford is 1-2 on field goals and 3-3 on extra points.

The Mississippi College defense will be the toughest test of the season for the Cru offense. The Choctaws lead the ASC in rushing defense, giving up just 44.0 yards per game on the ground. Opponents are averaging 21.8 points per game, 262.5 yards passing and 306.5 yards of total offense against MC. Teams are converting just 26 per cent of the time on third down and 31 per cent of the time on fourth down on the season. The Choctaws have forced 14 turnovers (11 INT, 3 fumbles) and have an ASC-best 28 sacks on the year. DB Corey Cooley leads the team with 41 tackles and he also has 4.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks and two interceptions. DT Brannon Willisson leads the Choctaws with 11.5 tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks. DB Jonathan Bradshaw has a team-best four interceptions. Fifteen players have 10 or more tackles on the season for MC and 47 total players have at least one tackle. P Jonathan Russell is one of the nation's best, averaging 42.7 yards per punt. He has had two kicks blocked and opponents have a kickoff return and a punt return for a touchdown against the Choctaws this season.

**When Mississippi College has the ball --** The Choctaws have been one of the most explosive and balanced offenses in the ASC this season. MC is averaging 40.3 points, 180.0 yards rushing, 291.5 yards passing and 471.5 yards of total offense per game on the year. The Choctaws convert 40 per cent of the time on third down and 50 per cent of the time on fourth down this season. MC has turned the ball over 12 times (7 INT, 5 fumbles) and surrendered 11 sacks. QB Adam Shaffer is the key to the offense. He is 108-194 on the season for 1,647 yards and 16 touchdowns. WR's Jake Allen and Marcus Terry are the top targets. Terry leads the team with 28 catches and he has 512 yards and five touchdowns. Allen has 27 catches for 533 yards and five scores. RB Chris Blanton is the top running threat with 569 yards and nine scores on the ground this year. The Choctaws have used 11 different players to carry the ball, three quarterbacks have thrown passes and 17 players have at least one reception on the year. Dusty Coleman is a threat on punt returns, averaging 12.9 yards per return with an 82-yard touchdown return. The Choctaws are also averaging 22.7 yards per kickoff return. PK Kyle Kruse has been solid, hitting 6-8 field goals on the season and converting 29-31 extra points. Kruse has not hit a field goal from longer than 36 yards, though and he has also had a field goal blocked on the season.

The Cru defense has been dominant this year, ranking first or second in the ASC in every statistical category. Opponents are averaging just 13.3 points, 52.0 yards rushing, 194.5 yards passing and 246.5 yards of total offense per game this season. Teams are converting just 21 per cent of the time on third down and 35 per cent of the time on fourth downs on the year. The Cru has forced 24 turnovers (14 INT, 10 fumbles) on the years and UMHB has recorded 23 sacks on the year. LB Jerrell Freeman leads the team with 47 tackles and he is tied with Eric Henri for the team lead in tackles for loss at 8.0. Henri has 37 tackles, 3.5 sacks, 3 pass break-ups and two fumble recoveries. DE Chad Hilton leads the team with 4.0 sacks and he has 7.5 tackles for loss. Seven different players have 20 or more tackles on the year for the Cru, 22 players are in double figures in tackles and 43 total players have tackles on the season. Fourteen different players have sacks. CB Brett Parker leads the team with three interceptions and Derrick Williams, Elliot Barcak and Bryson Tucker have two picks apiece. P Joel Munoz is averaging 40.0 yards per punt and has put 12 of his 20 kicks inside the opponent's 20-yard line. Opponents are averaging just 5.5 yards per punt return and 14.8 yards per kickoff return against the Cru on the season.

**Daniels Finds Paydirt Again ... and Again ... and Again -- RB Quincy Daniels (So., Belton)** set a career-high and tied a school single-game record with three rushing touchdowns against Louisiana College last Saturday. Daniels narrowly missed his fourth 100-yard rushing day, finishing with 97 yards on the ground. For the season, Daniels has 645 yards and nine touchdowns on just 85 carries. He also has a touchdown reception and a kickoff return for a score. Just six games into his sophomore campaign, Daniels has already moved into UMHB's top ten in career rushing yardage with 757 yards. He still has a ways to go to catch ninth-place Isaac Shaw. Shaw ran for 1,512 yards in his career. With 11 total touchdowns on the year, Daniels needs just one more score to move into a tie for 10th place on the UMHB single-season touchdown chart.

**Welch Sparkles -- QB Josh Welch (Sr., Copperas Cove)** was solid once again, despite sitting out the last 23 minutes of the game. Welch was 5-9 passing for 108 yards and he added 40 yards rushing on just four carries with a 29-yard touchdown run for the Cru's second touchdown of the game. Welch has 11 touchdown passes on the season and already ranks fifth on the UMHB single-season list. He needs just four more to tie the school single-season record of 15 TD passes Welch set as a freshman in 2004.

**D-Line Piles Up The Numbers --** The Cru continues to rotate at least two defensive lines each game. That may be holding the players individual numbers down some, but the defensive line is compiling some very impressive numbers as a unit. Cru defensive linemen have combined for 145 total tackles, 31.0 tackles for loss and 13 sacks on the season. **DE William Dewease (Sr., Jewett)** leads UMHB defensive linemen with 22 tackles and **DE Chad Hilton (Sr., Magnolia)** has 7.5 tackles for loss and 4.0 sacks to lead the unit. Hilton also has two blocked kicks. The defensive line has also forced five fumbles and recovered three of them on the year.

**Henri's Big Day -- MLB Eric Henri (Jr., Lake Dallas)** provided points for the Cru for the second straight week with a 5-yard fumble return for a touchdown against Louisiana College. Henri finished the game with six tackles, three tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, the fumble recovery and a pass break-up. For the season, he second on the team with 37 total tackles and is tied with Jerrell Freeman for the team lead with 8.0 tackles for loss. Henri also went over 100 career tackles last Saturday by pushing his total to 105. Henri's 3.5 sacks are second on the team this season.

**Double Duty Is No Problem For Munoz -- P/K Joel Munoz (Sr., Ferris)** is handling the workload of punting and placekicking just fine this season. Munoz is a perfect 5-5 on field goals and has hit 39-41 extra points. He leads the ASC in kick scoring with 54 total points. Munoz is also averaging 40.0 yards per punt and has put 12 of his 20 kicks inside the opponent's 20-yard line this season. Muoz also averages 58.8 yards per kickoff and has three touchbacks on the year.

**Do It All Owen -- RB Chris Owen (Sr., Corpus Christi)** may not get the attention that Jarvis Thrasher and Quincy Daniels attract, but he has been invaluable to the Cru this season. Owen has 182 yards and three touchdowns on 39 rushing attempts, he has caught four passes for 64 yards, is averaging 10.2 yards on five punt returns and has completed his only pass attempt of the year for 12 yards and a crucial first down on a fake punt against Hardin-Simmons.

**Tough In The Middle --** The Cru continues to dominate the middle quarters of game, outscoring opponents 237-34 in the second and third quarter this season. UMHB holds a 126-28 edge in the second quarter and 111-6 in the third quarter.

## LAST YEAR'S MEETING UMHB 41, MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE 14 Oct. 21, 2006 • Belton, TX • 1,651

The Crusaders defense forced four turnovers and the offense rolled up its best total of the season as UMHB cruised to a 41-14 victory over Mississippi College. The win keeps the Cru unbeaten in ASC play and sets up a showdown of top six teams against Wisconsin-Whitewater next weekend.

UMHB took a 7-0 lead after a Jerrell Freeman interception set up Josh Welch's four-yard TD run. A partially blocked punt gave the Cru a short field again and Jarvis Thrasher cashed in with a 12-yard scoring run. Damian Davis ran for a three-yard score to cut the lead to 14-7 with 4:15 left in the first quarter, but Freddie Rollins added a three-yard scoring run and Zach Newcomb hit a 36-yard field goal to put UMHB up 24-7 at halftime. Anthony Carter caught a 54-yard TD pass from Welch on the opening possession of the second half and Rollins added an eight-yard scoring run to push the lead to 38-7. Davis ran for a one-yard score and Newcomb hit a 43-yard field goal to provide the final margin.

UMHB intercepted MC quarterback Brad Madden four times to help overcome giving up 349 yards of total offense. The Crusaders rolled up 356 yards of total offense. Rollins ran for 78 yards and a pair of scores and Thrasher added 69 yards and a TD. Welch was 4-10 passing for 102 yards and a TD and Carter caught three passes for 80 yards and a score. Madden was 18-38 for 265 yards and Jake Allen caught six passes for 116 yards for the Choctaws.

## 2007 GAME-BY-GAME

### UMHB 51, CHRISTOPHER NEWPORT 19

Sept. 8, 2007 • Belton, TX • 2,888

The Cru overcame a sluggish first quarter to dominate the next two quarters as UMHB went on to crush 12th-ranked Christopher Newport 51-19. The win avenges UMHB's 15-10 loss to the Captains in last year's season opener.

After the Captains took a 7-0 lead, UMHB exploded for 30 second-quarter points. Chris Owen ran for a TD, Joel Munoz hit a 27-yard field goal, Patrick Oliver caught a pair of Josh Welch TD tosses and Quincy Daniels ran 35 for a score to make it 30-7 Cru at the half. Welch, Daniels and Josh Saenz added third-quarter TD runs to put UMHB up 51-7 before CNU scored a pair of meaningless late TD's to cut the final margin.

Daniels finished with 158 yards and two touchdowns on 10 carries and Jarvis Thrasher added 113 on 15 carries. UMHB finished with 500 yards of total offense and Oliver had three catches for 46 yards and a pair of touchdowns in his first collegiate football game.

The Cru defense held the Captains to 107 first-half yards of total offense and forced four turnovers. Jerrell Freeman had a team-high seven tackles and Eric Henri added four tackles, two sacks, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery as UMHB dominated in every phase of the game.
